LES GRANDE MARQUES? The term meaning 'Great Brands' encompasses the world's most popular Champagne houses most have heard of. Many of these Champagne houses buy grapes from plots all over the region, in addition to the ones they own.

GROWER CHAMPAGNE The term Grower Champagne indicates a producer who grows their own grapes and also vinifies the wine.

BOURGOGNE whites are esteemed for their terroir-driven Chardonnay. Typically, Burgogne Blanc, Chablis and Mâconnais are unoaked with whites from within the Côte de Beaune usually oak-aged. Aligoté is the less famous white grape from Burgogne. The best examples are dry with high acid, floral and herbaceous with lemon fruit.
